### **Annual Toys for Tots Holiday Toy Drive November 13 through December 10**

SUMMIT, NJ, November 11, 2024 – The Summit Policemen's Benevolent Association #55 (PBA) and Summit Firefighters Mutual Benevolent Association #54 (FMBA) are hosting the annual United States Marine Corps Reserve Toys for Tots holiday toy drive beginning Wednesday, November 13, through Tuesday, December 10.
