

New Update on Expanded Student Meals – Grab & Go

Due to the COVID-19 Closure of Schools in Summit, we have applied and been approved by the NJ Department of Agriculture to operate temporarily under the SSO program.

The Seamless Summer Option (SSO) is a Federal meal program that encourages more School Food Authorities (SFAs) already participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) to provide meals during periods longer than 10 school days of closure.

Q: What does this mean for student access to meals during this period in Summit?

A: **All resident children under the age of 18** regardless of the school or eligibility in the Free/Reduced Program are eligible for breakfast and lunch “grab-and-go” meals at our food pick-up locations

MEAL DISTRIBUTION TIMES, LOCATION AND WHAT YOU NEED TO DO

All meals will be available for pick up at:

Students may pick up meals from either location regardless of their home school

Q: What do I need to do to obtain the meals?

A: Guidelines for picking up meals:

- Primary – Any child under the age of 18 who comes to the food distribution sites will be provided with a grab-and-go breakfast and lunch.
- Secondary -- Any adult who shows up will need to produce proof of residency (driver's license, utility bill or lease document, etc.) and they must have a list of the child's name(s) and age(s).

FAILURE TO PROVIDE THE NECESSARY DOCUMENTATION WILL RESULT IN DENIAL OF MEAL PICK UP
