# Information on Summit's Single-use Plastics Ordinances

Summit, NJ will enforce a city-wide ban on carry-out plastic bags, polystyrene (Styrofoam) containers and restrictions on use of plastic straws **starting January 1, 2021**.

## What bags are allowed?



Restrictions do not apply to garbage and pet waste bags, newspaper sleeves, laundry/dry cleaning bags or bags used to wrap baked goods, frozen food, meat, vegetables and bulk items.

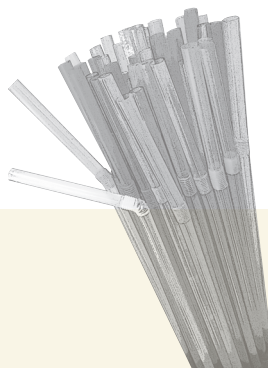
## What is banned and what is restricted?

- 🍃 A ban applies to all **single-use plastic carry-out bags**. Customers should bring their own bag or use an alternative provided by the retailer (for a cost or for free).
- 🍃 Businesses offering take-out food service will be required to find an alternative to **polystyrene containers**.
- 🍃 **Plastic straws** will be given by request only.

## Why are single-use plastics a problem?



Americans use **100 billion plastics bags** each year; only **1% are recycled**. They end up in landfills, waterways and neighborhoods.



Plastic straws are not recyclable. **Millions are used in the US every day.**



Carry-out plastic bags and Styrofoam containers can take up to **1000 years to decompose.**
